## What is a typical family?

Il over the world, families live together, work together and play together. But how are families different? And what is a 'typical' family? Let's look at a typical family in two different countries – the UK and India – to get a picture of family life in each place.

### The UK

There are 26,473,000 households in the UK. 18.6 million of these are families, and 12.5 million of these are married couple families – this is the most common family type in the UK. In general, UK families are small. The average number of children is 1.8, compared to the OECD (Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development) global average of 2.63.

British families like technology: 65% of households have a computer and 79% have got a mobile phone. They like cars, too! In fact,

40% of households have got two cars.

Pets are very popular in the UK and about 52% of households have got a pet: that's over half! Cats are very popular, with a total population of 7.9 million.






#### India

In India, 78% of households have four people or more. Why are households large? This is because many people live in extended families, where children, parents, cousins and grandparents all live together under the same roof.

Many companies in India design and make new technology, but at the moment only 9.4% of families have got a computer at home. Not many families have got a car, either: only
