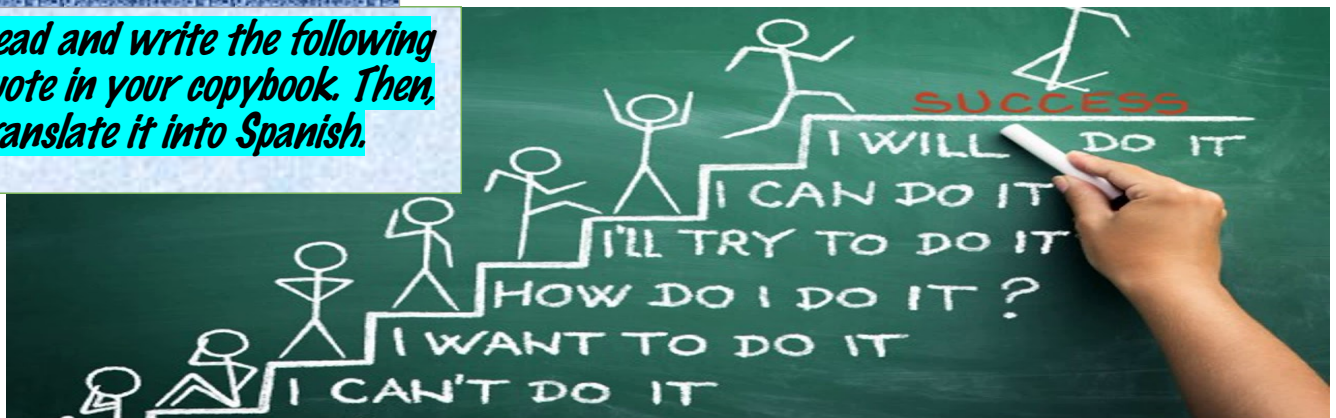

Indefinite

It's used with SINGULAR, count nouns to refer to a thing or an idea for the first time.

Indefinite article

The indefinite article is used:

- 1 with professions.
*I'm **a** teacher.*
*She's **an** architect.*
- 2 with some expressions of quantity.
***a** pair of **a** little **a** couple of **a** few*
- 3 with some expressions of frequency.
once a week** **three times a day
- 4 in exclamations with *what* + a count noun.
What a beautiful day!
What a pity!

A

the general rule of using **a** before words that start with consonants (sounds.)

Articles

Articles are words that define a noun as specific or unspecific.

Definite

It's used with SINGULAR and PLURAL, count and noncount nouns when both the speaker and the listener know the thing or idea already

Definite article

The definite article is used:

- 1 before oceans, rivers, hotels, theaters, museums, and newspapers.
***the** Atlantic **the** Guggenheim Museum*
***The** Times **the** Ritz*
- 2 if there is only one of something.
***the** sun **the** president **the** government*
- 3 with superlative adjectives.
*He's **the** richest man in the world.*
*Jane's **the** oldest in the class.*

AN

an before words that begin with vowels (sounds.)

Examples

Articles		
a/an	the	no article
I'm a teacher.	The Pacific Ocean is huge.	We're architects.
He's a hit man.	The sun is bright today.	She had dinner with her father.
That's an apple.	You're the busiest person I know.	I come home on foot.

The definite article is the word *the*. It limits the meaning of a noun to one particular thing. For example, your friend might ask, "Are you going to **the** party this weekend?" The definite article tells you that your friend is referring to a specific party that both of you know about. The definite article can be used with singular, plural, or uncountable nouns. Below are some examples of the definite article *the* used in context:

Example Please give me the hammer.

Example Please give me the red hammer; the blue one is too small.
