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## ENGLISH CONDITIONALS

<b>ZERO Conditional</b>	<b>If + Present Simple, Present Simple.</b> If you <u>heat</u> water at 100 degrees, it <u>boils</u> . <b>Use:</b> To talk about things that are always true, like a scientific fact
<b>FIRST Conditional</b>	<b>If + Present Simple, Simple Future.</b> If it's sunny, we <u>ll go</u> to the park. <b>Use:</b> To talk about possibilities in the present or in the future
<b>SECOND Conditional</b>	<b>If + Past Simple, Present Conditional.</b> If I <u>won</u> a million dollars, I <u>would buy</u> a new car. <b>Use:</b> Imaginary situations in the present or future
<b>THIRD Conditional</b>	<b>If + Past Perfect, Perfect Conditional.</b> If the weather <u>had been</u> good, we <u>would have gone</u> water-skiing. <b>Use:</b> Imagine situations in the past

# JUST is just great!

**JUST = RECENTLY**

Mary has *just* finished her homework.  
Now she can go to the movies.

**JUST = IMMEDIATELY**  
SOMETHING IS GOING  
TO HAPPEN SOON

He is *just* getting ready now.

**JUST = ONLY, MERELY,  
SIMPLY**

Richard is *just* the spokesman,  
not the CEO.

**JUST = CLOSE TO THE TIME**

Jennifer finished the report *just* as her  
boss asked her for it.

**JUST = EXACTLY,  
PRECISELY**

This is *just* the information I need to  
finish my report.

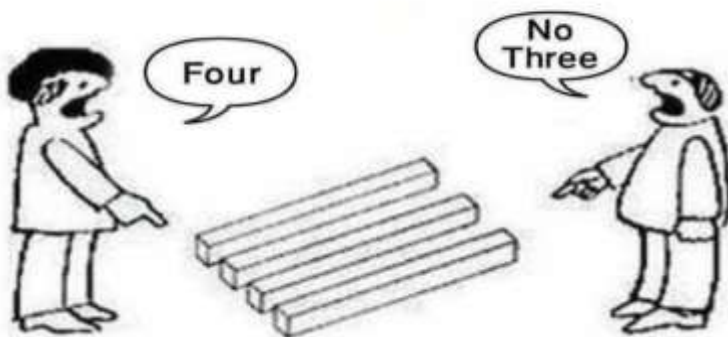
